

Career and Technology Studies

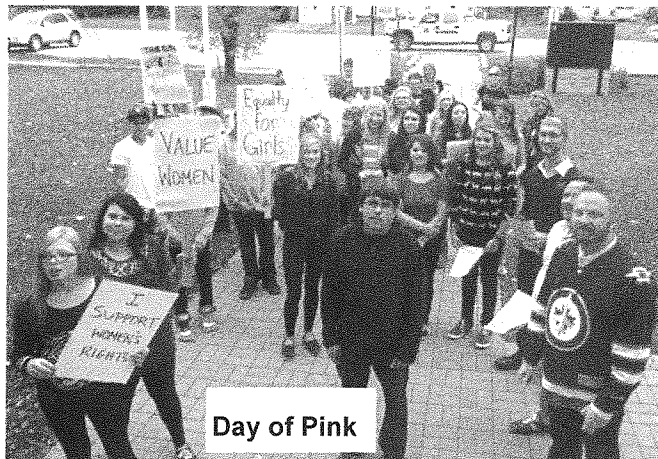
Once again Gimli High School is actively participating in the Career and Technologies Strategy. This strategy is employed in various rural school divisions across the province and allows students to experience authentic learning through internships and apprenticeships in the community. Currently Gimli High School has over 20 grade 11 and 12 students working with community partners to explore careers they are interested in. These placements consist of 75 hours on the job as well as "pre", "during" and "post" placement assignments. Students are also required to obtain a first aid CPR certificate, attend a Safe Workers of Tomorrow safety presentation and participate in a site safety audit. The opportunities are endless and can be as varied as working with a mechanic at an automotive repair shop, to working with a nurse in a hospital and everything in between!
