Waterman recognized for leadership skills

Breanna Waterman is being recognized for her leadership skills and sense of citizenship by the Manitoba Council for International Cooperation (MCIC). The grade 12 student from Erickson Collegiate (ECI) is one of four Manitoba high school graduates being awarded MCIC's Global Citizenship Award. Through their local and global actions, these students are changing and improving the lives of hundreds including children, youth, people with disabilities and those living in poverty beyond our borders.

According to Breanna, who is the daughter of Rick Waterman and Michelle Wilman, "A global citizen is a person who works to end in-

ternational inequality by helping to provide the resources for communities to become self-sufficient. A global citizen will also work to educate others on global citizenship."

As a leader with Students Making a Difference (SMAD)

and through her involvement in creating the Leave a Legacy Fund, which is designed to provide financial assistance for students at ECI wishing to go on international volunteer trips, she is doing exactly that. Breanna plans to attend the University of Winnipeg to study Bio Psychology and Business.

The Global Citizenship Award was established in 2009 to recognize students who have engaged in meaningful leadership and global citizenship volunteer activities aimed at a more just and sustainable world. Each will receive a certificate at their graduation ceremony and a \$200 award.

(MCIC) is a coalition of over 40 organizations involved in international development. An independent non-profit organization, MCIC is responsible for distributing Government of Manitoba funds des-

ignated for international development and emergency relief and rehabilitation and works within Manitoba to build understanding and engagement on international issues.
