Coming together as a community, Gimli High School students collected more than 500 pounds of non-perishable food items with the help of their neighbours.

Some 18 students participated in Trick or Eat, a campaign the school has participated in for the past nine years. Trick or Eat is where students go door-to-door collecting food instead of candy. In an effort to promote a fair trade lifestyle, Zach Gross from Manitoba Council for International Co-operation, provided the school with the trade chocolates and pamphlets.

Students distributed the chocolates while going door to door on Halloween. Designated a Fair Trade town, students encouraged residents to consider Fair Trade products.

"Instead of going there for candy, we actually drop candy off", said Rob Jantz, head of social justice department at Gimli High School.

According to Jantz, food is still being dropped off to the school. The food raised is donated to Evergreen Basic Needs, the Gimli food bank. The Trick or Eat campaign is an effort to address issues surrounding local poverty. According to Jantz, the students have a good understanding, going back to the school with "giving" stories regarding residents who have donated.
