## MCIC Congratulates IDE

IDE has been awarded the first Nestlé Prize in Creating Shared Value for an innovative program in Cambodia. In the past two years, IDE's Farm Business Advisor program has enabled 60 rural Cambodian entrepreneurs to start small agricultural distribution and consulting businesses, which in turn have helped 4,500 small-scale farm households increase their net income by 27 percent or US \$150.

The prize of 500,000 Swiss Francs (over CAD \$450,000) will allow IDE to recruit and train an additional 36 advisors, generating approximately CAD \$2 million in new income for more than 4,000 rural households across Cambodia. The award was presented at a ceremony in London.
